Update: Employee Handbook

The district has revised and updated the employee handbook. It should be published and shared in the very near future. Make sure to become knowledgeable about the components of the handbook and its contents. All employees of the district will be held accountable for knowing and adhering to the components, in particular, the "Standards of Conduct" section as we find many complaints against members stem from this section even though the majority are false. The district uses the components of the handbook and in other instances various Board policies when accusing our members of infractions. Whenever in doubt, seek guidance to avoid any unnecessary and stressful problems.

Items of Interest

- We still have not been able to begin contract negotiations. The district remains at a stalemate with the BTU. Until a new contract is negotiated and ratified there will be no COLA
- If presented with a PIP by your supervisor, make sure to contact me for review and support. Your supervisor may not issue you a completed PIP, as you are entitled to input according to Board Policy GCO-RE.
- If you need member support while working with another member then please let me know. We cannot allow others to get involved in Union member matters because that is detrimental to membership.
- Make sure to complete the Climate survey which was sent to all members. Your responses will always remain confidential.

Transformation/Distinguished Principal and District Administrator Process

The district is attempting to change the processes for earning distinction as a TP, DP, or DDA. Even though our contract indicates that there are to be no limits on the number of members identified and who receive these distinctions, apparently that is not pleasing to some. An attempt is now underway to circumvent the process which would reduce the number of candidates who are deemed eligible and those who satisfy the current process to earn the distinction. This attempt to alter the process may also eventually result in current TP, DP, and DDA's losing their designation. We will be monitoring the situation and addressing it accordingly according to the parameters of our current contract.
